SMART START GLOSSARY OF TERMS

- **Adapted Learning-** the programs of instruction provided to students during school closures and periods when adjusted school schedules are needed to comply with health orders
- **Classroom-based Virtual Education** - A model of Distance Learning wherein classes intended for instruction that is instructed through technology and received outside the physical classroom
- **Equitable Education** - instruction that is fair, impartial, and nondiscriminatory
- **Health Orders** - enforceable laws that are usually accompanied by one or more Directives that provide legally binding instructions for how to comply
- **Health Screening** - Temperature check and a series of basic questions about your health condition and recent history
- **High Risk** - a person with a medical condition or frailty that makes him/her more likely to become ill
- **Hybrid Learning-** a combination of onsite and offsite education delivered through face-to-face and virtual learning when students and teachers cannot be in the classroom for short amounts of time
- **Outbreak** - a sudden increase of a specific illness in an area
- **PPE** - stands for Personal Protective Equipment. Includes masks, face shields, gloves, and other face coverings used to prevent the spread of infection
- **Protocols-** a set of plans for carrying out the expectations of a program
- **PTSB** - Professional Teaching Standards Board
- **Qualitative Data-** measurable test results/scores
- **Learning Management System (LMS)** is a software application for the administration, documentation, tracking, reporting, automation, and delivery of educational courses, training programs, or learning and development programs.

- **Active Time Spent in LMS** – This indicates the time a student is active in a course that is logged and recorded by a learning management system (LMS) and is used by the district as a method to track participation in the course.
 - **Student Submissions in an LMS** – This indicates required coursework submissions by a student in a logged course and recorded by a learning management system (LMS) and used by the district to track participation in the course.
 - **Other Indicators in an LMS** – This indicates specific feature(s) that are logged and recorded by a learning management system (LMS) and is used by the district as a method to track participation in the course.
 - **Teacher Tracked Work Time** – This indicates the time a student is actively working on group projects and/or offline work that is logged and recorded by the course teacher and is used by the district as a method to track participation in the course.
- **Sanitation/Sanitize-** measures taken for the sake of health and cleanliness
 - **Social Distancing-** also called physical distancing, it means staying at least 6 ft apart from other people that are not in your family
 - **Symptomatic-** when a person shows signs of illness. For COVID, cough, fever, and shortness of breath
 - **Tier I Schedule for COVID 19-** Open In-person classes and activities, as appropriate. Minimal adapted learning on a limited, as-needed basis. Most students in the school at the same time under the provisions of current health orders. Social distancing and face coverings to the greatest extent possible. Buildings open to all students.
 - **Tier II Schedule for COVID 19** - Hybrid Combination of in-person and adapted virtual learning is required due to local or state health directives. Social distancing and face coverings to the greatest extent possible for those attending in person. Students will be assigned to Blue or Gold Group based upon transportation routes.
 - **Blue Group** will attend physical classroom on Monday/Tuesday with Virtual Education Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday.
 - **Gold Group** will attend Physical Classroom on Wednesday/Thursday and Virtual Education on Monday, Tuesday, and Friday.

- **Tier III Schedule for COVID 19** - Closed School buildings closed to students due to local or state health directives or orders. School districts will follow provisions in the approved virtual learning plan. Buildings are not open to students.

- **Virtual Learning Formats:** There are two types of virtual learning formats - Asynchronous learning & Synchronous Learning
 - **Asynchronous learning** - is a general term used to describe forms of education, instruction, and learning that do not occur in the same place or at the same time.

 - **Synchronous learning** is a general term used to describe forms of education, instruction, and learning that occur at the same time, but not in the same place.
